Tucson, AZ - Forty states and the District of Columbia signaled their intent to vie for part of the \$4.35 billion in federal monies in the US Department of Education's Race to the Top (RTTT). Fifteen states and the District of Columbia have been identified as first round finalists. Proposals for the second round of competition will be due in June.

One of four key components in competing for this money at the local level is to have in place a data system incorporating the use of a local instructional improvement system to provide teachers, principals and administrators with meaningful support and actionable data to systematically manage continuous instructional improvement.
